Bill D. Fowler, 90, of Boxley, Arkansas, passed from this life on July 25, 2015 at his home. He was born March 14, 1925 at Mounds, Oklahoma, the son of Troy Wayne and Dixie Carroll Fowler. He was a veteran of World War Two, serving in the United States Navy and had retired from the Agriculture Stabilization and Conservation Service in January of 1983. He was a farmer, a truck driver and co-owner of Boxley Farms, Inc. which he named. He was a member of the Boxley Baptist Church where he served as a deacon and former Sunday School teacher.
