



## Cecil Tolliferro Lovelace

February 20, 1918 - September 5, 2011

Cecil Tolliferro Lovelace, 93, of Witter, Arkansas, died September 5, 2011 at Meadowview Healthcare and Rehab in Huntsville, Arkansas. He was born February 20, 1918 at Stanley, Arkansas, the son of Edwin Tolliferro and Clara Tweet Beene Lovelace. He was a carpenter and a veteran of World War Two serving in the United States Navy. He was a member of the Huntsville Branch of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and a former member of the United Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners.
