July 10, 1918 - May 27, 2008

Dillard Lee Reeves, 89, of Huntsville, Arkansas, died May 27, 2008 at the Northwest Medical Center-Springdale. He was born July 10, 1918 at Witter, Arkansas, the son of Ausie Lee and Charity Bell Keck Reeves. He was a retired barber and a veteran of World War Two, serving in the United States Army. He had been a Baptist Deacon for over fifty years and was currently serving as a Deacon Emeritus at Faith Southern Baptist Church in Huntsville.
