Elizabeth Suzanne May, a former naturalist-interpreter and resident of Fayetteville, AR, died unexpectedly on July 13, 2015 at the age of 45 at home. Elizabeth enjoyed hiking and backpacking in the Boston Mountains, lived in Indonesia and Bahrain and traveled to France, and was a musician and singer. She also enjoyed trips to Holden Beach, NC and visiting the NC Aquarium at Southport, NC, and the Schiele Museum of Natural History on her frequent visits to Gastonia, NC. She enjoyed playing the piano and beadwork. She designed and crafted bracelets, necklaces, and jewelry as well as crafted fragrances for the home
