Emil Krevokuch, 91, of Boca Raton, Florida, formerly of Huntsville, Arkansas, died March 18, 2012 at Harbours Edge in Delray Beach, Florida. He was born November 11, 1920 at Chicago, Illinois, the son of Joseph and Anna Curido Krevokucha. He was a union carpenter and a veteran of World War Two, serving in the United States Army Air Corps.
