James Robert Scott, 80, of Huntsville, Arkansas, died June 3, 2008 at Circle of Life Hospice in Springdale. He was born December 13, 1927 at Springfield, Missouri, the son of Wayne Floyd and Mayme Louise Powell Scott. He graduated from Central High School in Springfield and later attended Drury University in Springfield. He was a veteran of World War Two, serving in the United States Navy. He had owned and operated Scott's Family Center in Huntsville for many years. He was a member of First Baptist Church in Huntsville where he had served as a Deacon for over fifty years. He was a former scoutmaster, American Legion baseball coach and longtime member of the Huntsville Volunteer Fire Department having served as Fire Chief. He had been a member of Hayes-Smith Post #137, American Legion for sixty years.
