-Mother called her "Squeaky"

-Brothers called "Skook"

-Dad called the kids (the three youngest kids, I think, is what she said) "The Katzenjammer Kids" (cartoon in the paper about little kids always getting into things)

-Her father was a man of few words, her mother did most of the talking; he'd say what he wanted to say

-The farm was 125 acres; when she was in 3rd grade they started trading milk in town; her father traded milk for groceries; left milk in the stores for the store to sell, they would sell cream and milk door to door and especially in the stores. The old milk truck was what all of the kids would ride to school in, but they all had to walk home. Once going up a dirt road, Betty (maybe Becky?) Kipple fell out when the back door opened and they all looked back and she was sitting in the middle of the road; there were not many cars back then and theirs was the only vehicle to travel that way.

Somewhere I have recordings of more of her answers to my various, random questions that I had. I will dig them up and upload them somehow. I was asking these questions to help me remember who she was. Our last words were shared on February 8th and we exchanged "I love you." I will always love her. I will remember to always offer someone a seat, always have a joke ready to share, and always make sure no one was cold. She couldn't relax unless her companions were seated and had some kind of blanket over them. She is my MeMe and her immense kindness is impossible to forget.
