Larry Len Brown, 62, of Fayetteville, Arkansas, died May 9, 2012 at the Washington Regional Hospice Home in Fayetteville. He was born November 20, 1949 at Parsons, Kansas, the son of Billy L. and Alfreda May Bolander Brown. He graduated from Parsons High School, attended Baker University in Baldwin City, Kansas and graduated from Labette County Community College in Parsons. Before his retirement, he was a radiologic technologist for forty-two years, most of that time at Wesley Medical Center in Wichita, Kansas. Since moving to Fayetteville in November 2010, he worked with Arkansas Support Network and volunteered at the Shiloh Museum of Ozark History in Springdale when he wasn't fishing or watching Razorback Sports. He was diagnosed with oral cancer in August of 2011. He fought the disease courageously through four surgeries and radiation therapy. Throughout his illness, he lived life to the fullest every day, walked his dogs, enjoyed his friends and loved his family. He passed away peacefully after spending two days at the hospice home. He is survived by his wife, Becca Martin-Brown, whom he married April 7, 2012; his daughter, Kristi Evans of Kansas City, Kansas; his son, Devon Brown of Las Vegas, Nevada; his stepdaughter, Amanda Martin of Springdale, Arkansas; his sister, Karen Parker of Maple Valley, Washington and two grandchildren, Kai and Dayne Evans. A memorial service will be held at 1:30 P. M. Saturday at the barn on the grounds of Shiloh Museum. His cremated remains will be interred in the Brashears Cemetery.
