She was a kind and caring person who was always ready to help anyone in need. She always saw the good in people and never gave up hope in anyone and was therefore

loved by so many. She loved to talk to anyone she met but was also a great listener and a wonderful person in which to confide all your troubles and secrets. She will be greatly missed by so many friends and family. "We'll see you on the other side that's just around the corner".

Jean was preceded in death by her parents, James and Roberta Kidd; three siblings, two brothers and one sister; and one daughter Rebekah Cahoon of Fort Worth, TX.
