Thomas Edmond Halloran, Jr. died peacefully at home surrounded by his family on May 17, 2017. Tom was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on October 26, 1941, to Thomas Edmond Halloran and Catherine Theresa Logue Halloran.
